- 1. Wenatchee Fire Department, 1929-2020
- 2. Wenatchee Police Department, 1931-2004
- 3. Statue of Guppo the Clown, founder of the Wenatchee Youth Circus
- 4. We're "Better Together" with this mural painted by Fight the Beige in 2020
- 5. "Coyote Reading a Candy Wrapper" by Richard Beyer
- 6. The life cycle of salmon, a mural painted by Marlin Peterson in 2016
- 7. The Wenatchee Valley Museum & Cultural Center was established in 1939
- 8. Charming "roadside" dining at McGlinn's
- 9. Mural painted by Fight the Beige in 2021
- 10. One of Downtown Wenatchee's lasting "ghost signs"
- 11. Wenatchee's historic Carnegie building has been home to the Wenatchee Valley Museum & Cultural Center, Wenatchee Public Library, and more. It is currently home to the Washington State Apple Blossom Festival.
- 12. Signs of the Apple Blossom Festival can be found throughout Downtown Wenatchee
- 13. The Historic Conrad Rose Mansion served as the Jones & Jones funeral home from 1924-2007
- 14. The Historic Liberty Theater has been serving Wenatchee since 1919
- 15. S.H. Kress & Co. was the trade name of a chain of five-and-dime retail department stores. Wenatchee's was built in 1930 or 1931
- 16. Power up at one of the newer additions to Downtown Wenatchee, Epoch
- 17. Known as Miller's Clock, it was made in 1915
- 18. Downtown Wenatchee features numerous floral arrangements, including this custom display for Firehouse Pet Shop
- 19. Wenatchee Public Library is home to a mural painted by Fight the Beige in 2021
- 20. Home of the Wenatchee World since 1926
- 21. Many historic signs can still be found downtown, including the original sign for Liberty Parking
- 22. Tucked behind Iwa Sushi, this robot mural was painted by Ron Evans
- 23. Several orange news racks can be found downtown; open one to grab the latest issue of The Comet
- 24. Downtown's newest mural, painted by Sara Hasslinger in 2022
- 25. The Historic Cascadian Hotel, built in 1929
